

“Suite” Stamping
Embossing on Chipboard Tutorial

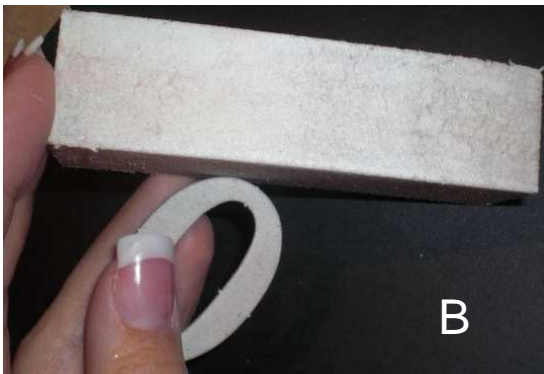
Assemble your supplies:

- * Chipboard
- * Sponge dauber
- * heat gun
- * scissors or tweezers
- * Craft ink
- * embossing powder
- * Powder Pal
- * Sanding Block

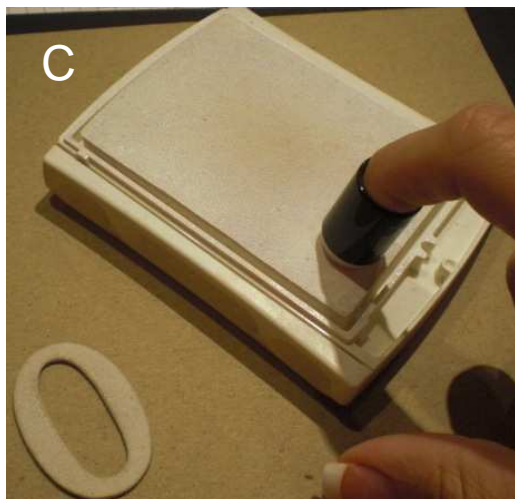
Chipboard is very popular right now. But what can you do with it? The possibilities are endless. This is just one great way to dress up your chipboard pieces. ☺ Have fun and get creative!



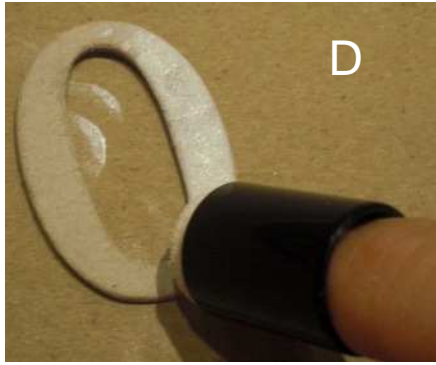
- A. Assemble your supplies. Shown here: craft ink, sanding block, chipboard piece, and sponge dauber.



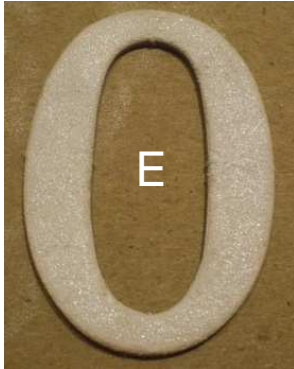
- B. Sand off all the little ‘nubs’ on the chipboard from where it was attached to the larger chipboard frame.



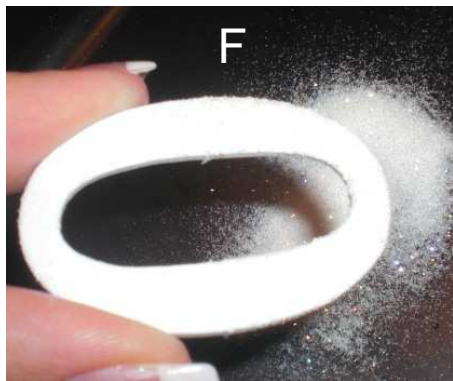
- C. Put the sponge dauber on your finger and dab several times in the craft ink. I’ve also placed a scrap piece of cardboard on my desk so that I don’t get craft ink on my regular stamping surface.



D. Dab craft ink onto the chipboard piece until it is entirely covered.



E. Completely covered in craft ink.



F. Hold chipboard over Powder Pal and sprinkle embossing powder (I used Iridescent Ice) over half of the chipboard piece.



G. Tap the chipboard on the Powder Pal to get rid of excess embossing powder.



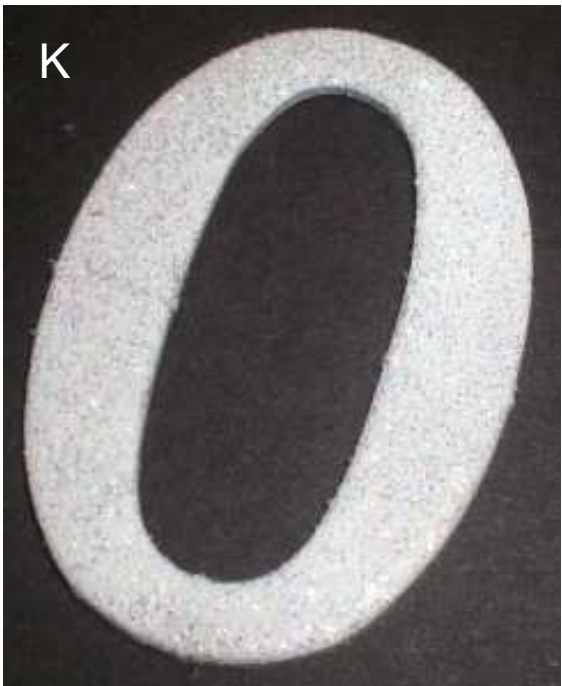
H. Turn the chipboard 180 degrees and pour embossing powder over the other half and tap off excess powder into the Powder Pal.



- I. Place the chipboard piece back onto your work surface. Use your scissors or tweezers to hold it in place while you heat emboss it.



- J. Use your scissors or tweezers to hold the chipboard piece in place while you heat emboss it. Be careful not to rub off any of the embossing powder with your fingers or the scissors.



- K. **Your finished embossed fabulous chipboard!** Now it's ready to be attached to any project you desire. (I choose to attach my chipboard mostly with sticky strip.)
